PRINCIPAL QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Be a practicing Catholic in good standing with the Church (i.e., able to receive the Sacraments and, if married, in a valid Church marriage.)
- 2. Be deeply committed to the development of the faith life of the teachers and students and dedicated to the ministry of Catholic education.
- 3. Have a minimum of five years of teaching experience in a Catholic school. Such experience should be sufficiently broad to provide an understanding of the Prek-8 or 9-12 structure and the potential to function as an educational leader in an elementary or secondary school.
- 4. Have a Master's Degree in School Administration from an accredited university approved by the State of Virginia or a Master's Degree in another academic area and completion of the following graduate courses: School Law, Evaluation of Instruction and Curriculum, Special Education, School Finance and Educational Leadership from a state approved program and successful completion of the School Leadership Assessment (SLA). The courses and assessment must be completed within three years of being hired.
- 5. Hold appropriate Virginia Administration and Supervision Certification or be eligible to obtain this certification within three years of hire.
- 6. Hold Basic Diocesan Religion Certification or be eligible to obtain this certification within three years of hire.
