## WHAT IS CCHD?


CCHD is the Church's anti-poverty program in the United States, addressing public policies and the lack of skills and resources that keep people in poverty. **CCHD follows the example of Jesus, who said to the man lowered through the roof, "Rise, take up your bed and walk."** 

## WHERE DOES YOUR CONTRIBUTION GO?

Your contribution funds projects right here in our diocese and around the country that help people start businesses, gain job skills, and learn how to work with others to improve their communities. Last year, your generosity enabled us to give \$120,000 in grants to six projects in our diocese that assist our neighbors in need.

## HERE'S HOW YOUR CONTRIBUTIONS ARE BRINGING GOD'S LOVE TO OUR NEIGHBORS IN THE DIOCESE OF ARLINGTON THIS YEAR:







\$20,000 to Micah Community Café in Fredericksburg, which trains homeless people to work in the food service/hospitality industry, serves high-quality meals to people who experience food insecurity, and creates a space for all community members—those of means and those in need—to share a table in equal dignity. St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception Parish is an active partner of the Café.



\$20,000 to **NOVALACIRO**, a membership-led organization that helps members of the local Latino community address community needs and concerns, develop leadership skills, and become economically self sufficient.



\$10,000 to Fredericksburg Regional Head Start for its family-strengthening Parent Project, which equips low-income parents to participate actively in their children's education, and to advance their own education and job goals. This project works closely with St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception Parish.



\$5,000 to the **Consumer Advisory Council of Pathway Homes**, a Fairfax non-profit that provides permanent housing to people with mental illness, to help Pathway's clients learn how to advocate for their own needs and for policies that improve the lives of people with mental illness.



A \$50,000 national grant to **Centreville Immigration Forum**, which helps immigrant workers as they strive to receive just wages, acquire English language skills, build stable lives, and contribute to the community.
