


Preparing for Volunteers

WorkCamp is...

Since 1990, the Catholic Diocese of Arlington has had the privilege of sponsoring a one week high school youth WorkCamp for repairing and improving residences in counties within the Diocese. Approximately 800 high school teens from the Diocese are divided into crews of five and perform work closely supervised by dedicated adult leaders and volunteer contractors.

Warmer, Safer, Drier

The focus of the work during the week is to make your home warmer, safer, and drier. A few examples of the work we perform include building wheelchair ramps, replacing windows, installing new doors and floors, and replacing roofs.

We do our best to perform the repairs that are important to you. However, we may not be able to accomplish everything that you need or want due to limited time, weather, or material delivery delays. If we start a project during the week that is not finished when the crew leaves, we will finish it as soon as possible.

Who We Serve

We serve anyone in the community who is in need. Home repairs are provided at no cost. Confidentiality and respect for your privacy are stressed heavily during the months of training that all participants receive prior to WorkCamp.

What to Expect

Prior to WorkCamp

A project manager will visit your home, discuss the program and repairs to be made. Keep an eye out for materials being delivered up to two weeks before WorkCamp. If needed for the project, portable toilets and dumpsters will be delivered prior to our arrival.

Typical Day of WorkCamp

The work will be performed **June 22nd - June 25th**. Crews will be present from 9am - 4pm. They will arrive in vans with their own tools, water, and lunches. If you are home during the day, you are invited to eat lunch and spend time with the crew. Each day they will clean up prior to leaving your residence. The crew will invite you to an Appreciation Lunch on June 26th at Frederick County Middle School.

Following WorkCamp

During the month of July a WorkCamp representative will stop by to view the work, and collect unused materials and trash. If you would like to keep some of the unused materials or if you are able to dispose of trash, please let the crew know. Porta-Potties and Dumpsters will be collected by the company that delivered them the week after WorkCamp.

Safety

Safety is our top concern. You can assist the volunteers in working safely by keeping an eye out for any hazards near the worksite. Help keep kids and pets safe by ensuring they are kept a safe distance from the work area. *Drugs, alcohol, and firearms are strictly forbidden when WorkCamp volunteers are present.*
