# Why a "Silent" Retreat?

For many years I have encountered men and women at the end of a retreat who have remarked in these or similar words: "You know, I was really afraid at the thought of spending an entire weekend in silence... but it was... wonderful."

Isn't it strange that people "fear" silence? Well... perhaps not, considering how we are trained and conditioned by our culture to technologically inundate every waking moment (and even sleep) with beeps, chirps, alarms, music, information, notifications, conversation, facts, figures, images, haptics, flashing lights, and sound bytes.

# No wonder we are distracted in prayer!

A silent retreat affords the opportunity to leave behind the noise and distractions which eclipse the quiet whisperings of the Holy Spirit in the deeper realms of our souls. Sitting quietly with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament we can "treasure and ponder" the Word uttered in Eternal Silence and echoing in the words of the Gospels. Without silence we cannot truly **listen**... and as one old sage put it, "In prayer, if you do not learn how to listen, you shall never hear."

Perhaps the most eloquent consideration of seeking God in silence is heard in the simple and profound words of St. Teresa of Calcutta:

Being silent... "plunges us into deep silence of God where aloneness with God becomes a reality. The Word of God is speechless today. In the Eucharist His silence is the highest and


