When the Son Rose on Easter Sunday only one or two persons on the face of the earth still had Faith. Read about one of them at: FJ4G All the rest of the men and women who had known and loved and followed Jesus Christ were faithless... and hopeless.

When the sun rose on Easter Sunday, two Marys, Joanna, Suzannah, and Salome were on their way to the tomb. They were not going there to see if Jesus had Risen as He said; they had completely forgotten His repeated prophecies that He would rise on the third day. Their hope was merely to wash and anoint His dead Body, and then to lovingly lay those pierced and torn earthly remains to rest in death until the end of the world.


They were in for a surprise.

Frequently Catholics are not very well informed about the events of that glorious day. Most never take the time to sit down quietly and contemplatively read through the four accounts; Matthew's Gospel chapter 28 (can be read in about 3 minutes); Mark chapter 16 (againabout 3 minutes to read): Luke 24 (closer to 10 minutes); and two chapters in John-20 and 21 (perhaps 15 minutes). In about half an hour one can easily read and savor these accounts of Jesus' Resurrection and the events of that "most unusual day."
