The Bishop & the Brothers



In 1974 Pope John Paul II sent Bishop Thomas Welsh to Northern Virginia to found the Diocese of Arlington. Three Bishops, hundreds of priests, and tens of thousands of new brothers and sisters later, in the Year of Our Lord 2024, we celebrate 50 years of life as a Diocesan Family — and Renew our commitment, our vision, and our mission to find and follow Jesus Christ and help others to do the same.

This year also, our **Year of National Eucharistic Revival**, we turn our minds and hearts to treasure and ponder the great Gift and Mystery of Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. Renewing our vision and understanding of the True Presence of Christ in the Bread of Life is essential to our mission to bring His light and love to our confused world in these challenging and opportune times.

One crucial element of this Eucharistic renewal is a deeper appreciation of the Royal Priesthood of the Faithful which is conferred on all Christians in the Sacrament of Baptism. Of course the primary effect of Baptism is the washing away of the guilt of Original Sin. We also receive Sanctifying Grace and the Real Presence of God the Holy Spirit is "breathed" into our souls.

Another effect is often overlooked: an indelible "character" is emblazoned on our souls. This "mark" or "seal" in a deep and mysterious way a unique silent retreat. The first Christians faced many challenges from political and spiritual adversaries. The needs of the early Church were very pressing, but Christians learned very soon to trust in the Lord Jesus, their Savior. Their strong relationship with the living God made them giants of Christian spirituality — an excellent example for us in today's troubled world.

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
