ever caring, ever strong,


always present, always just:

- · Help making a report to the proper authorities

- · Referrals for therapy or counseling
- · Monthly Sharing groups: A safe and supportive environment for victims to share their experiences and connect with others.
- · Masses for healing and prayer services: Special liturgies and prayers for victims/survivors and their families.
- · Educational presentations: Workshops and presentations on topics related to abuse and healing.
- · Annual retreat: A Saturday retreat for victims/ survivors to focus on healing, emotional support, and opportunities for growth.
- · Listening sessions with Bishop Burbidge: An opportunity to victims/survivors to meet with the bishop and share their experiences.
